Lincoln, And Barbara Bagge, Spinster, and Minor, of Kings Lynn Saint  
Margaret in the County of Norfolk with Consent of Her Father the Reverend  
Charles Bagge D.D. of Kings Lynn, St. Margaret aforesaid and County aforesaid  
Health and Grace. WHEREAS it is alledged that Ye have resolved to proceed to the Solemnization of true and lawful  
Matrimony,

and that you greatly desire to cause and obtain that the same may be solemnized in the Face of the Church;  
We being willing that these your reasonable and honest Desires may the more speedily obtain their due Effect; and to the  
End therefore That this Marriage may be publickly and lawfully solemnized in the Parish Church *Saint Margaret in  
Kings Lynn or Chapel of St. Nicolas thereof in the County of Norfolk* by the Rector, Vicar, or Curate thereof  
without the Publication or Proclamation of the Banns of Matrimony, and at any Time of the Year; PROVIDED there shall  
appear no lawful Impediment in this Case, by Reason of any Precontract entered into before the 25th of March 1754,  
Consanguinity, Affinity, or any other Cause whatsoever, nor any Suit, Controversy, or Complaint, be now depending or shall  
be moved before any Judge Ecclesiastical or Civil, for or by Reason thereof; and likewise that the Celebration of this Mar-  
riage be had and done publickly in the aforesaid Church *or Chapel* — — — — — between the Hours of  
Eight and Twelve in the Forenoon: WE for lawful Causes, graciously grant this our Licence and Faculty, as well to you  
the Parties contracting, as to the Rector, Vicar, or Curate of the aforesaid Church *or Chapel* — — — — —  
who is designed to solemnize the Marriage between you in the Manner and Form above specified, according to the Rites of  
the Book of Common-Prayer, set forth for that Purp se by the Authority of Parliament: PROVIDED always, that if in this  
Case there shall hereafter appear any Fraud suggested to us, or Truth suppressed at the Time of obtaining this Licence,  
Then this Licence shall be null and void to all Effects of Law, as if the said had never been granted; and in this Case  
we inhibit all Ministers, (if any Thing of the Premises shall come to their Knowledge) that they do not proceed to the  
Celebration of the said Marriage without consulting us. Given under our Seal this *thirty first* — — — — — Day of
